Metanoia Church Kids CAMP Medication and Medical Emergency Policy

In an effort to provide a safe, welcoming environment for your child and other Kids CAMP children to learn about Jesus, the following is Kids CAMP's medication and medical emergency policy. Should you have any questions, please contact Annie Byrd, Deacon of Children Ministry.

- All Kids CAMP volunteers receive regular, routine training on emergency preparedness—such as medical emergencies. It is Kids CAMP's policy to focus on education and prevention.
- Kids CAMP volunteers are not permitted to administer OTC nor prescription medication to children under any circumstance.
- Kids CAMP does not provide OTC medications—such as Tylenol, Motrin/Ibuprofen,
 Benedryl, etc—for children nor are such medications kept in any of the Kids CAMP rooms.
 If your child requires any medication, please make arrangements upon signing in your child so that you can personally administer what is required.
- If your child has a medical condition such as allergies or asthma that may make him/her sick, you must inform the Kids CAMP volunteers about the triggers and symptoms to look for upon checking in your child. Kids CAMP volunteers will take necessary precautions to assure that your child is safe while you worship.
- All medications for your child must be kept with you, the parent/guardian, at all times and are not permitted to be stored in your child's belongings or anywhere else in the Kids CAMP rooms under any circumstance.
- Kids CAMP is a nut-free zone. A nut-free snack is provided. If your child requires a special diet, please pack a snack for your child.

What will happen in the event of a life-threatening medical emergency situation?

- A Kids CAMP volunteer will immediately bring your child to the lobby area (between Kids CAMP and Worship Gathering spaces) while another volunteer will come and get you out of the Worship Gathering so that you can tend to your child's needs and/or administer medication to your child as needed.
- For this reason, if your child has a known life-threatening condition (such as allergies or asthma) we highly recommend that you sit close to the door during the Worship Gathering so that you can be located quickly.
- Volunteers will call 911 should they believe your child is having a life-threatening reaction.
- Volunteers will assist in gathering your child's belongings to aid in your leaving the premises quickly.
